Note: Utah State Law (Section 59-2-103-5) requires a property owner to declare the proper classification of their property whenever a deed records to obtain a primary residential tax exemption. Similar filings are also necessary to maintain or receive greenbelt property tax exemptions. Please consult the applicable County Assessor's Office to determine whether this exemption applies to this transaction.

- Verify the wiring instructions provided by the title company and confirm them directly with your bank or a trusted contact to prevent wire fraud.
- If applicable, complete the water right or water share transfer after closing with the state or with the irrigation company and ensuring that all necessary documentation and fees are properly submitted.
- File for a primary residence exemption with the county assessor to potentially qualify for property tax savings.
- Sign up for "Property Watch" from your county recorder (if available)
- Arrange for payment of HOA/Association dues and ensure that you are aware of the payment schedule and any specific requirements.
- Coordinate with the seller to transfer the utilities into your name and set up any desired automatic payments or billing preferences.
- Arrange for the changing of locks either through a locksmith or your home warranty company.
- Identify the garbage and recycling pick-up days in your new neighborhood to properly dispose of waste and recycling materials.
- Set up or transfer TV/internet services and gym memberships according to your preferences and needs.
- Familiarize yourself with the location of shut-off valves for water and gas in case of emergency situations.
- Forward your mail using the United States Postal Service (USPS) online forwarding service.
- Take pictures of receipts for any deductible expenses related to the purchase of the property or potential reimbursements.
- Prepare for moving day by fully charging your cell phones, having essentials like paper towels, bathroom tissue, and plastic cups/utensils readily available. Also, keep some cash on hand for unexpected expenses.
- Inform your insurance agent about your new home and ensure that your homeowner's insurance policy is active and covers the correct property.
- Consider creating a home maintenance checklist to keep track of regular tasks such as changing air filters, servicing HVAC systems, or scheduling lawn care.
- Research local service providers, such as plumbers, electricians, and landscapers, and keep their contact information handy for any future needs or emergencies.
- Familiarize yourself with any homeowner association (HOA) rules, regulations, and restrictions, and ensure compliance with their guidelines.
- Take the time to explore your new neighborhood and introduce yourself to neighbors, making connections and getting to know the community.

Several companies & service providers may require notice of your new address.

- Auto, life, & health insurance companies. (Ensure your policies reflect the correct information and coverage).
- HR department at your workplace for payroll and benefits purposes.
- Transfer your prescriptions to a new pharmacy and notify your healthcare providers, including doctors, dentists, & other specialists.
- Banks, credit unions and credit card companies, especially those that mail monthly statements.
- Subscription services, such as streaming platforms, online shopping accounts, or meal delivery.
- Any professional associations or fraternal organizations you are a member of.
- Driver's license & other state/professional licenses and permits. Remember other government agencies, such as the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Medicare, Medicaid, and the Social Security Administration.
- Schools, educational institutions, and student financial aid lenders.
- Magazine & newspaper subscriptions.

What is the Primary Residential Exemption?

(§§ 59-2-103, 59-2-103.5 and R884-24P-52)

The primary residential exemption is a 45% property tax exemption on most homes in Utah. This means you only pay property taxes on 55% of your home's fair market value.

Eligibility

You may be eligible for the primary residential exemption if you occupy your home for 183 consecutive days or more in a calendar year.

The exemption applies to your house and up to one acre of land.

Apartments, condos and mobile homes also qualify. Up to one acre of land per residential unit qualifies for the primary residential exemption, **IF** used exclusively for residential purposes.

Properties inhabited by tenants also qualify, if they reside in the property for 183 consecutive days or more in a calendar year.

You must inform the county if you no longer qualify for the primary residential exemption.

Application

You likely already have the primary residential exemption applied to your property. Most homes that are used as residences and sold are presumed to continue as residences, so the primary residential exemption is ongoing without a new application.

Certain counties may require a new application (Form PT-23 or county equivalent) in certain circumstances. The Utah Code allows counties to pass an ordinance that requires an application should the property change ownership, change from a non-primary residence to a primary residence, or if the county reasonably believes the property may no longer qualify. Most often these counties require an application from the new owner when a home is bought and sold.

A homeowner should always submit an application to the county if they inhabit their property for less than the full calendar year.

KEY POINTS:

- The **primary residential exemption** is 45% of your home's fair market value.
- **Some counties may require an Application for Residential Property Exemption (Form PT-23 or county equivalent) to receive the exemption.**
- **All other counties require a signed Residential Property Declaration (Form PT-19A) when title is transferred to a new owner.**
- **A homeowner should always submit an application to the county if they inhabit their property for less than the full calendar year.**
- **It is recommended to submit an application annually with current leases if your residential property is inhabited by a tenant.**

DID YOU KNOW?

- **A building that is under construction and intended to be used as a residential property upon completion can qualify for the primary residential exemption before it is completed.** An application may be submitted to the County Assessor.
- **You can confirm you receive the primary residential exemption by determining any difference between the market value and taxable value on your Valuation Notice (received around the end of July) or Tax Notice (received around the start of November). The taxable value will be 55% of the market value.**
- **Only one household may claim the exemption within the state of Utah.** Married couples living apart cannot claim two exemptions. Unless couples have **legally** separated, they can only claim one exemption.
- **The primary residential exemption has existed since 1982, and was raised to 45% in 1995.**

Residential Property Declaration

Beginning 2019, if a county does not have an ordinance requiring an application for the primary residential exemption, a residential property declaration (Form PT-19A) is required when title changes on a home. New homeowners must submit a residential property declaration to the county assessor within 5 business days of title change.

This ensures all homes receiving the primary residential exemption genuinely qualify, and reduces the chance that out-of-state residents who own residential properties in Utah are incorrectly identified as domiciled in Utah for state income tax purposes.

Are Title Thieves Really Stealing Utah Homes?

If you've seen infomercials promoting services to protect homeowners from title theft, you might wonder how likely such an event is. While title fraud is possible, it is extremely rare.

Benefits of Title Insurance: Built-in Coverage for Title, Fraud, and Forgery

While media coverage has highlighted this concern, many homeowners are already protected by title insurance, often purchased during settlement and closing. An owner's policy typically protects against unmarketable titles, and many residential owner's policies issued since 2008 include extended coverage for post-policy fraud, forgery, and title issues. Coverage specifics can vary, and deductibles may apply depending on the policy type. In many cases, policyholders may be covered for up to 150% of their property's original purchase price.

Property Watch Service

Corporate Fraud Watch

The Utah Division of Corporations offers a service to help businesses monitor and receive alerts about changes to their corporate information. This can help identify potential identity theft or fraudulent activity. Email notifications are sent within 24 hours of any modification to a business address, registered agent, or principal. The service costs \$3.00 per year.
